First make sure bluetooth is turned on. Press hold control button 4 secs till blue light blink. Then on phone or other bluetooth thingy find Major IV in list & click it. If ask enter code or say yes on both. When done LED go solid blue. If dont work check manual for reset. Also make sure not connect to other bluetooth things. Note steps can vary depend model and stuff. Marshall Major IV got 100 mw power, mean it strong but clear sound. It also got special ear thingy that cover whole ear, give good noise isolation. Oh and it got 32 ohm impedance, thats good for compatibility. And yeah it use bluetooth to connect wirelessly. You can also plug in with usb or 3.5 mm connector. If control strip not work try this: check power, make sure its on by press hold button 2 secs. Then check connection, maybe its just bluetooth thingy. And last check firmware. Firmware Update Might Be The Solution Maybe updating firmware will resolve any issues with the control strip, so you should check manufacturer's website or get in touch with their support to see how it's done. If that doesn't work then try resetting your headphones - just refer to manual for details on how to do this reset thingy . Last option is to contact customer support team because if none of above steps resolve issue then they'll be able to give you some specific troubleshooting tips or arrange repair if needed. Troubleshooting Not Charging Headphones First, ensure that your headphones are properly connected to power source - either place it on wireless charger or use included USB cable . Then check if headphone is placed correctly on charger or if USB cables are securely plugged in both ends. LED indicator should start blinking red then turn orange and finally green when fully charged, so if it's not showing any colors there might be some charging problem . Try using different power source or USB cable to rule out any issues with original one . If that still doesn't work then contact customer support for further assistance. Troubleshooting No Audio When Connecting Headphones Make sure other headphones you're trying to connect are working properly first. Then check if they're securely plugged into 3.5mm jack on your Marshall Major IV headphone. If your Marshall headphones aren't turning on or won't connect to a device via Bluetooth, try these steps: First, make sure they're actually turned on by holding down the control button. If that's good, put them in pairing mode by holding the same button for four seconds - you'll know it's working when the light starts flashing blue. Next, check your audio player or phone to ensure Bluetooth is enabled and your device isn't already connected to something else. Once you've got both devices ready, search for available connections on your audio player and select "Major IV" from the list. If prompted, enter a code or confirm the pairing request on both devices. After that, check the light on the headphones - it should turn solid blue when everything is working properly. If none of this works, try restarting the headphones according to the manual, and if that still doesn't work, you might need to contact Marshall customer support for further help. They'll be able to give you more specific instructions or even arrange a repair if needed. Keep in mind that these steps might vary slightly depending on your headphone's model and firmware version.
